Thoughts about pilgrimage on Vancouver Island

A **pilgrimage** is a <u>journey</u> or search of <u>moral</u> or <u>spiritual</u> significance. Typically, it is a journey to a <u>shrine</u> or other location of importance to a person's <u>beliefs</u> and <u>faith</u>

- What I see today on Vancouver Island:
 - issues generally considered to be of moral or spiritual significance:
 - 1. Nature resplendent [old growth forest; ocean]
 - 2. Repentance about the experience of First Nations
 - Places of importance to beliefs and faith
 - 1. Parks [e.g. Cathedral Grove; Pacific Rim/Juan de Fuca]
 - 2. Residential school sites [e.g. Alert Bay, Port Alberni] razed
 - Highly individualized spirituality
 - Bishop McMenamie from Alert Bay to Victoria; then Port Alberni; Cowichan Valley; Port Renfrew

Vancouver Island Pilgrimage Needs and Exploration

Needs

- Route of journey safe for reflection & varied ages
- Supportive infrastructure
 - Social: churches; safety; public.
 - □ Physical: rest and reflection points; toilets; food; overnight.
 - ☐ Information: internet; route maps.

Exploration

- ?? What is our story [stories]
- ?? Who might be attracted
- ?? Is there a culminating end point – why is it significant, and to whom
- ?? Is there a minimum length
- ?? How do we share experiences
- ?? How do we spread the word
- ?? Is there a managing entity
