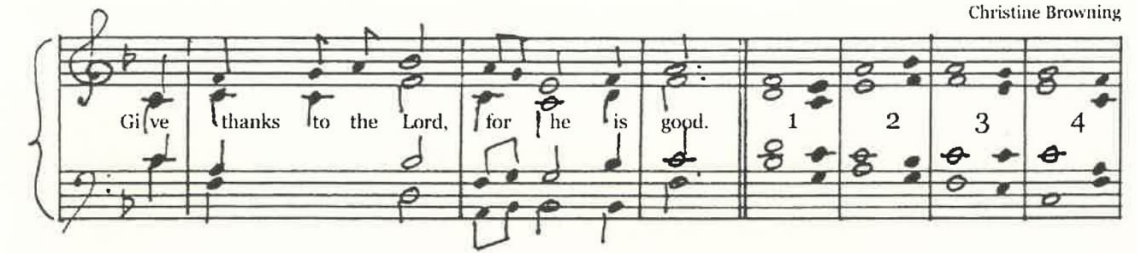

- 3 For he satisfies the **thirsty**
- 4 and fills the hungry with **good things. R.**
