

Be Aware - Email Phishing: It has come to our attention that parishioners have been receiving emails from someone claiming to be The. Rev. Gail Rodger using a false email address.

An email fraudster is sending out emails to people associated with our Incumbent.

The first one that we know of was sent out October 15th using the email address rev.grodger@gmail.com.

The text of the first email:

From: Gail Rodger Subject: GOD BLESS

Hi, I need a favor from you, Please email me back as soon as possible.

The text of the follow up email:

I need to get a Nordstrom gift card for a friend of mine but I currently can't do it because of my busy schedule. I will pay you back, Let me know if you can handle it Rev. Gail Rodger

I encourage you to get the word out about this fraud and to pass on the message that no one from our parish or diocese will ever contact people through any email proxy other than the legitimate extensions using @stpeterandpaul.ca or @bc.anglican.ca. Messages from The Rev. Gail Rodger will always come from incumbent@stpeterandpaul.ca or grodger@bc.anglican.ca

Please read the sending email address carefully before opening or responding to an email.

Our administrator has taken steps to report this to the synod office as there has also been other occurrences of email fraud within other parishes in our locality.

If you receive an email like this or are an email you are unsure about, first of all it is important to know you have not been hacked, the fraudsters are just trying to obtain money from you. For more information please view the Canadian Antifraud Centre website's advice at http://www.antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca/index-eng.htm and also report it to us here at admin@stpeterandpaul.ca so we can make people aware of the scam emails and addresses to look out for. Lastly it is important to block the fraudulent senders email and delete or add the email to your spam folder; this will help filter out these kinds of emails.
