Celebrant: I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day a Saviour, Christ the Lord.

Joy to the World

Joy to the world! The Lord is come: let earth receive the King; let every heart prepare him room, and heaven and nature sing.

Joy to the earth! The Saviour reigns: let us grad songs employ, while fields and floods, rocks, hills, and plains repeat the sounding joy.

Lighting of the four Advent Candles and the Christ Candle

Celebrant: In the season of Advent we have used the Advent wreath and its candles to help us get ready for this great celebration of the birth of Christ.

When we lit the first candle, we are reminded our hope is in Jesus.

- All: May God's love shine in our hearts.
- *Celebrant:* When we lit the second candle, we acknowledged the Lord is our peace.
- All: May God's peace be reflected in our lives.
- *Celebrant:* When we lit the third candle, we know abiding joy is found in the Lord.
- All: May God's joy in us, spread joy to the world.

Celebrant: When we lit the fourth candle, we are reminded that the birth of Jesus Christ is the gift of the unconditional love of God to all humanity.

- All: May God's love move us to action in loving each other.
- *Celebrant:* Today we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, the Hope, Peace, Joy and Love for all people.
- All: Dear God, as we light the center candle, may we celebrate with the full joy the birth of your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Gloria: (sung) Glory to God on High

Glory to God on high, and peace to all on earth. We worship you, we give you thanks, our heavenly King. We give you praise, almighty God and Father blessed in glory bright.

Our Saviour, Jesus Christ, the Father's only Son, the sacrificial Lamb, who saves the world from sin, have mercy Lord. Beside the Father's hand enthroned, now hear our prayer.

You only are the Lord. You only are most high. You only are the holy one, Lord Jesus Christ. And now you reign with Father and with Spirit one in glorious light.

Collect:

Holy God, we thank you for the message of peace and of love that Christmas brings to our distracted world. Give peace among nations, peace in our land, peace in our homes, and peace in our hearts as we remember the birth at Bethlehem of the Prince of Peace.
