Joy to the world! The Lord is come: let earth receive the King; let every heart prepare him room, and heaven and nature sing.

Joy to the earth! The Saviour reigns: let us glad songs employ, while fields and floods, rocks, hills, and plains repeat the sounding joy.

No more let wrongs and sorrows grow, nor thorns infest the ground; he comes to make his blessings flow far as our sin is found. He rules the world with truth and grace, and makes the nations prove the glories of his righteousness and wonders of his love.

The Story of Faith is Proclaimed

First Reading: Isaiah 9:2-7

A reading from Isaiah.

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.

For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire.

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named

Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it

with justice and with righteousness from this time onwards and for evermore.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 96

Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the whole earth. Sing to the Lord and bless his name; proclaim the good news of his salvation from day to day.

Declare his glory among the nations and his wonders among all peoples. **For great is the Lord and greatly to be praised;**

he is more to be feared than all gods.

As for all the gods of the nations, they are but idols; but it is the Lord who made the heavens. **Oh, the majesty and magnificence of his presence! Oh, the power and the splendour of his sanctuary!**

Ascribe to the Lord, you families of the peoples; ascribe to the Lord honour and power. Ascribe to the Lord the honour due his name; bring offerings and come into his courts.

Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; let the whole earth tremble before him. **Tell it out among the nations: "The Lord is king! he has made the world so firm that it cannot be moved; he will judge the peoples with equity."**

Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; let the sea thunder and all that is in it; let the field be joyful and all that is therein. **Then shall all the trees of the wood shout for joy before the Lord when he comes, when he comes to judge the earth.**

Second Reading: Titus 3:4-7

A reading from Titus.

But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Saviour appeared, he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Saviour, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. **Thanks be to God.**

O Little Town of Bethlehem (Forest Green)

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by; yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

For Christ is born of Mary; and, gather all above, while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love. O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, and praises sing to God the King, and peace to all the earth.

Gospel Reading: Luke 2:1-20

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

'Glory to God in the highest heaven,

and on earth peace among those whom he favours!'

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

The gospel of Christ. Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given as love imparts to human hearts the blessings of God's heaven! No ear may hear his coming; but in this world of sin, where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in.

O holy child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; cast out our sin and enter in; be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel.

As your son came to proclaim the forgiveness of sins, and the assurance of life eternal; give to the departed, eternal rest and let light perpetual shine on them. Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

O Lord our God, may the Light and Hope of this night, and of your Son's Incarnation, reassure our hearts that you are among us, that you hear our prayer, and that you will be with us always, even to the end of the age. In the name of Jesus of Nazareth we pray. **Amen.**

(Due to Covid we do not pass the offering plate through the pews. The offering plate is in front of the font at the back of the church to accommodate your gift and is available before and after service.)

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Prayer of Thanksgiving

God of light and gladness, accept all we offer on this joyful feast. May we grow in love, uniting our lives to yours; in the name of the Holy One who is Lord now and forever. **Amen** Eucharistic Prayer (Please stand)

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord**.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth, because in the mystery of the Word made flesh you have caused a new light to shine in our hearts, to give knowledge of salvation in the face of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Now with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven, we lift our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

(Tune: Hark the Herald Angels Sing Melody)
Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might adored
heaven and earth are shining bright
with the glory of your light.
Loud hosannas now we sing! In the highest may they ring!
Blessed is the coming one, Christ, Emmanuel, your Son.

Holy God, source of life and goodness, all creation rightly gives you praise. In the fullness of time, you sent your Son Jesus Christ, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He healed the sick and ate and drank with outcasts and sinners; he opened the eyes of the blind and proclaimed the good news of your kingdom to the poor and to those in need. In all things he fulfilled your gracious will.

On the night he freely gave himself to death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Gracious God, his perfect sacrifice destroys the power of sin and death; by raising him to life you give us life for evermore.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Feed us, guide us, walk beside us, bless us with gentle light.

Recalling his death, proclaiming his resurrection, and looking for his coming again in glory, we offer you, Father, this bread and this cup. Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts, that all who eat and drink at this table may be one body and one holy people, a living sacrifice in Jesus Christ, our Lord. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

The Lord's Prayer

And now, with the words our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

We break the bread of life, and that life is the light of the world God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us to light and life.

(Tune Infant Holy Infant Lowly) God our Mother, Christ our Brother, Spirit in these gifts you vow By your giving, in our living, we become your body now

The table of love is offered for all people. It is Christ who invites us to meet love incarnate here, and all are welcome.

The gifts of God for the people of God. **Thank be to God.**

The Communion

(Communion will be offered from a standing position in front of the choir pews. It will be offered in one kind (bread only). It is the belief within the Anglican Church that receiving in one kind is considered full communion. If receiving, please walk single file on the right to the front. Remove mask and sanitize your hands just prior to receiving and re-mask to return to your seat. Responses to receiving the host include: Amen: Hallelujah; or Thanks be to God.)

Let us pray,

God of all, tonight you have united earth and heaven in sending Jesus to take our human nature. May we all share in the life abundant on earth and in the eternal kingdom. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ the Lord. **Amen.**

Candle lighting

As the light of love shines in the darkness so a candle's light shows the love of God to the world. And now, we'd like to invite you to light a candle.

(Candles are lit by passing the light on from one to the other along the pew. Please hold the lit candle upright and tip only the unlit candle to prevent wax from dripping. Once all the candles are lit, we will dim the lights and sing. We will then hold silence for a few moments.)

Silent Night

Silent night! Holy night! All is calm, all is bright round yon virgin, mother and child. Holy infant so tender and mild, sleep in heavenly peace, sleep in heavenly peace.

Silent night! Holy night! Shepherds quake at the sight. Glories stream from heaven afar, heavenly hosts sing alleluia, Christ the Savior is born. Christ the Savior is born.

(Please <u>do not blow out</u> your candles. Candles <u>will be snuffed out</u>. As the light of the candle is extinguished, we say)

May God's love live in your heart and shine in your life.

Blessing

May the true spirit of Christmas be with us all. The spirit of joy that overflows from the heart and makes neighbours rejoice, the spirit of peace that harmonises differences and makes music of our common life. The spirit of love that sings the mind of God to the world.

And may the blessing of the manger – God's creation all around; the blessing of the shepherds – God's people on the ground; the blessing of the angels – good news for all, and peace for the world, be among us, and remain with us, always.

Go, Tell it on the Mountain
